July Board Meeting

The July board meeting was held on Tuesday, July 16, 2024. Our current membership remains at 166 (139 Active, 27 Senior). For the fiscal year through June 30, 2024, Treasurer John Collar reported operating income of \$61,222.37, operating expenses of \$87,003.37, service income of \$26,710.28, service expenses of \$16,016.55, and net assets of \$49,814.90.

Through our Service Budget, we have awarded \$7,500 in scholarships to our High School Key Clubs. The membership of Sig Hutchinson and Gina Bunch were approved. The resignations of Hunter Bond, Craig Pleasants and Hurley Raynor were accepted with regret. The pre-billing for KI and District dues will be included in this quarter's dues. Looking at YTD comparisons, the meal cost is up considerably from last year. Pancake Breakfast is set for October 19, 2024. Volunteers are needed! Our annual Food Drive for Urban Ministries will be held in the month of August. The next meeting of the board will be held on Tuesday, August 13 at John Collar's office.

Remembering Bob



The Kiwanis Club of Raleigh wishes to extend its deepest condolences to the family of Bob Goodale following his unexpected passing from a serious car accident on July 24.

Robert "Bob" Selden Goodale was born December 12, 1933 in Marshalltown, Iowa, and was a long time resident of North Carolina. He was a lover of all people and a fearless wanderer, traversing the globe with family and friends to embrace the world's wonders. His soul found its deepest peace lying on his cot, under a blanket of stars. A recipient of the prestigious Order of the Long Leaf Pine, Bob was honored for his significant contributions to the state and his community through exemplary service and exceptional accomplishments. Persons named to The Order become honorary North Carolina "Ambassadors." Bob dedicated himself to a life of service, serving on numerous nonprofit boards and tirelessly working to improve his community and the lives of those around him.

Bob Goodale was a former Harris Teeter CEO and former NC Deputy Secretary of Commerce. In addition to his decades-long service on the ADCNC Board of Directors, where he also served as President, Bob has served on Healing Transitions Board of Directors and currently serves on HT's Board of Trustees. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Monarch, PIVOTPoint WNC, and Pavillon. He previously served on the Hanley-Hazelden Foundation Board of Directors, Hazelden National Advisory Committee; Hazelden, New York City Advisory Board, North Carolina Department of Corrections Substance Abuse Advisory Board; Rebound, Charlotte Board of Directors, Amethyst Foundation, and the Charlotte Treatment Center Board of Directors and Board Chair.

Bob served in the Army after receiving a B.S. degree from Iowa State University. He also received an M.B.A. from the University of Kansas. He's a recipient of The Order of the Long Leaf Pine. His other honors include the Trotter/Black Award, Hope Haven, Charlotte "For his unique contributions in the field of recovery" and the Order of the Hornet, Mecklenburg County, NC Board of County Commissioners' highest award. Bob's story of addiction and recovery is told in *SECOND CHANCES* by Gary Stromberg.

Bob's legacy lives on through his children: Rebecca Beardsley, Jennifer Beardsley, Amy Goodale-Johnson (Richard), Rob Goodale (Stephanie), Elizabeth Rushing (Mike) and Susan Brooks (Dave), as well as his 12 grandchildren and numerous great-grandchildren. Each day, Bob (Grandpa) lived to the fullest, reminding us all to embrace our wild imperfections, to be joyous, and to be free. Bob's spirit continues to inspire, encouraging us to seek adventure, cherish our loved ones, and live each day with an open heart.
