The May Board meeting was held on Tuesday, May 9 at John Collar's office. The resignations of Eric Ballenger and Kathy Morris were accepted with regret. The total club membership stands at 188 (161 active, 27 senior). Treasurer John Collar reported operating income of \$36,425.53, operating expenses of \$57,182.40, service income of \$26,136.11, service expenses of \$8,203.72, net assets of \$79,193.59.

Recommendations for Key Club scholarship recipients are coming in. Updates were given by the Charter Night and Golf Tournament board reps. Resolutions for Bill Garrett and John Beaman will be presented in the coming months. The board was reminded of the \$15 per ticket charge that was budgeted for the Durham Bulls game. At both the ICON's House of Delegates in June and the DCON's House of Delegates in August, amendments will be proposed on a dues adjustments.

Both Kiwanis International and the Carolinas District have set forth the reasoning here:

The district's amendment was first introduced to Carolinas Kiwanians at the February MidYear Conference.

If both amendments pass, the total change for Carolinas District Kiwanis members will be in increase of \$60 - or, about the cost of an average latte at your local coffee chop (\$5) purchased once a month. Some may be wondering **why Kiwanians even pay dues** to volunteer.....take a look at this piece.
