KIWANIANS HERE HONOR VETERANS

Colonel Olds Tells of Sherman's Occupation of City; Tribute to Benjamin

With eight veterans of the War Between the States present, the Raleigh Kiwanis Club yesterday had another of Chairman A. E. Bowen's unique programs and paid a tribute to the North Carolina soldiers of the Confederacy. Colonel Fred A. Olds, honorary Kiwanian, was speaker of the day. He told in graphic detail of the exciting events during the last hundred days of the war, dealing especially with the occurrences just prior to the surrender of General Johnston near Durham. He said that General Sherman treated the surviving remnants of the Confederate Army with great consideration and gave them rations for three weeks. He also described how Raleigh was surrendered to the Federals advancing from the direction of Clayton.

Before making his talk, Col. Olds introduced Superintendent W. F. Mangum of the Soldiers Home who in turn introduced the eight veterans. These were S. A. Austin, J. W. Taylor, B. F. King, J. T. Grimes, William Holcombe, B. M. Summerland, R. J. Harrison and W. F. Drake. Mr. Drake was presented as the sole survivor of the battle between the Monitor and Merrimac, the first fight between iron-clads. Each of these visitors were presented with a large can of smoking tobacco and a jar of candy through the courtesy of

J. C. Brantley and A. F. Bowman. J. W. Taylor, speaking for the soldiers, thanked the club for its entertainment and in simple words moved the gathering to deep emotion as he spoke feelingly of the few short days left to the remnant of the Confederate Army.

Other honor guests of the club yesterday were Mrs. R. R. Jones, of Winston-Salem, champion of North and South Carolina among women golfers; Mrs. J. E. Spitz, of Richmond, Va.; Mrs. Thalheimer, of Richmond, and Mrs. Alf Duckett, of Raleigh. Mrs. Jones and Mrs. Spitz are to play a match game of golf at the Carolina Country Club this afternoon at two o'clock and the Kiwanians were invited to attend the match.

In opening the meeting yesterday, President William Joyner told of the death of Captain J. C. Benjamin and asked the members to stand for a moment in silent prayer before having grace by Dr. J. B. Turner, of the Hayes-Barton Baptist Church. It was agreed that the club will attend the funeral of Captain Benjamin on Sunday afternoon and a special committee with William Duncan as chairman, was appointed to attend to details. It was also agreed that this committee will co-operate with the program committee to have a special memorial service in honor of Captain Benjamin next Friday. The club adjourned silently in his honor.

Relocating Link in No. 53.
Sanford, April 12.—The re-location and construction of State Highway No. 53 between Sanford and Fayetteville, which has been under way for several months, is nearly completed and it is thought that within a few days the road will be open for travel. It will eliminate two dangerous railroad crossings between Sanford and Olivia and will also take out a number of sharp curves.
